Building the nurses accommodation is a project that satisfies both the above criteria

Future work will include an additional 3 accommodation blocks 1 ablutions block a library and a school administration building.

Helena Goldie is a seventy bed teaching hospital currently teaching up to twenty nurses.

The hospital has been approved to expand to teach an annual intake of twenty student nurses

It will be one of three such hospital schools in the Solomon Islands to provide nurse training to Diploma standard

District 9810 from Victoria has undertaken to build two of the accommodation buildings

District 9630 has committed to building three accommodation buildings and one ablution block for shower and toilet facilities



A nurse training course runs over a three year period, as such there needs to be accommodation for at least 60 to 80 trainee nurses



The Current accommodation is for ten male and ten Female Students and is in a terrible state of disrepair.

The School already has two Lecture Halls and a dining hall built
